Show Information

- Arenas: Indoor arena for warm up and outdoor arena for competition. Lunging available in designated areas and may be restricted to certain times based on schedule.
- Entries: All entries and supporting documents will be accepted through HorseShowOffice.com First Come, First Served. Entries accepted passed the closing date IF space available. Cancellations prior to closing date will be refunded less office fee and online payment fee. No refunds given passed the closing date. No refunds for cancellations due to weather, Acts of God, accidents, or emergencies. No rider packets/bridle tags will be released until all fees are paid in full and completed waivers/supported documents.
- Biosecurity: Coggins must be within 12 months and Flu/Rhino Vaccine must be within 6 months.
- All horses must have competition number on at all times.



Schooling Shows

- Non-Compete Horses: Non-showing horses are allowed on grounds if space is available and entry form for non-compete is submitted.
- Ride Times & Scheduling: Ride Times will be posted on the Thursday prior to the show at HorseShowOffice.com Scheduling is used to facilitate pinning of the classes in a prompt and organized manner.
- Awards: All classes will be pinned First through Sixth. Specialty Awards including High Point, Sportsmanship and other awards will be awarded at the end of show day. Please See Awards Section for more information. All ribbons and awards must be picked up in person. They will be held for pickup for up to 2 weeks prior to show.
- Scoring: It is the responsibility of the competitor to verify the accuracy of all scores. Scoring errors must be reported to the Show Secretary within one hour of the official posting of the scores from the last class of the show day during which the score was earned.
- Dress and Equipment: Approved helmets and boots (paddock boots and half chaps are acceptable) required at all times while mounted on show grounds. Neat, conservative attire is requested; jackets are optional. Shirt must have a collar and sleeves. Only legal bits per DR121 and Annex A are allowed. (One whip no longer than 47.2 inches (120 cm), including lash may be carried by a mounted rider. All riders must wear properly fitted protective headgear at all times. Polo wraps, boots and Bell boots allowed.
- Western Dressage: Check out the website <http://westerndressageassociation.org/western-dressage-rulestests/> for rules and tests. Western Dressage riders must wear properly fitted protective headgear at all times while on a horse.
- Eventing Dressage: Check out the website <http://www.useventing.com/competitions/dressage> for tests.
- Rule Enforcement: All rules will be enforced from the time a competitor arrives on the show grounds. These shows are governed by United States Equestrian Federation (USEF) rules, except where noted. Please see www.usef.org/forms-pubs/F3p8pgrWgAo/dr-dressage-division or www.usef.org/forms-pubs/NpmAWxkXY6M/wd-western-dressage for complete information.
- Concessions: Light refreshments will be available for purchase
- Schooling & Arrival Hours: Show Grounds are open at 1:00pm on the day prior to the show and available for schooling until 6:30pm. On Show day the arenas will be open for schooling 1 hour prior to scheduled competition start.

Facility Info & Rules

- Trailer Parking and Haul Ins: All horse trailers will be parked in the front field (follow signs). Please remove manure, trash and all items from the field upon departure of show venue. This is a turn out pasture and we would like to keep it safe and clean for our horses.

- Car Parking: Please park on the north side of the facility in the large parking lot. Drive slow and watch for horses and pedestrians
- Dogs: No dogs allowed before, during or after events.
- No smoking of property at any time.
- Stabling: Limited stalls available. Initial bedding provided. Please leave stall stripped or tidy, no hay or feed may be left. Manure can be disposed of in the manure bunker on the north side of the barn. No tack stalls available. Stalls will need to be reserved directly with Katelyn via email and not through your show entry. They are by priority/need and discretion is used in allotment. Stalled Show Horses may use crossties in aisle way. Feed, tack and equipment can be stored in designated areas only, keep aisle way clear for machinery.
- Wash Racks: Outdoor Wash Stall is available on the west side of the barn. Do not hose horses off in fields or gravel.
- Access to Aisles and Barn: Please keep non stalled show horses out of crossties, indoor wash rack and distanced from KV Dressage client horses for biosecurity. No nose to nose contact or interaction between horses through stall fronts.
- Lunging: Please lunge horses in designated lunging areas
- Welfare: Show and Facility Management reserve the right to intervene with any actions or situation deemed dangerous or a concern to animal welfare including riding, care and handling of any horse on property.

Class Descriptions

- Sport Horse In-Hand: Sport Horse In-Hand classes evaluate a horse's potential as a dressage or eventing mount by judging its conformation (structure), movement (walk, trot, canter), and overall presence, focusing on harmony and athleticism; it's a key step in developing prospects from young horses to under-saddle competition, emphasizing proper training for forward movement and responsiveness, using specific equipment like show halters or bridles for control and presentation in a triangle pattern. Following the USEF rulebook: horses 5yrs and under are eligible. Horses two and over are to be

shown in a bridle. Horses under two as of January 1 of the calendar year are to be shown in a halter.

- USDF Materiale: This refers to a rail class where young horses (3-5 years old) are judged in groups on their walk, trot, canter, movement quality, and potential as dressage horses, evaluated for their breed's suitability for dressage. Stallions will be separated into their own class, but pinned together.
- Equitation Classes: These are group rail classes. Riders and horses of any age are welcome to enter. No Stallions permitted. Walk/Trot class can have movements equivalent to Intro B. USEF/USDF Dressage Seat Equitation is equivalent to First Level.
- Trainer In Your Ear Test: This test allows for 7 minutes in the arena to perform a test while receiving coaching via bluetooth or other communication device from your trainer. Tests are NOT judged. Trainer must remain outside of the show arena at all times, standing at E/B/C is permitted.
- Para-Equestrian WDAA Exceptional Rider Tests: No dispensation required to enter. Available to riders with physical limitations or disabilities.
- Walk Only Dressage Test: Please see test at end of Prize List
- Lead Line Tests: Please see tests at end of Prize List
- Dressage Trail Class: Dressage and Western tack welcome. Please see test at end of Prize List
- Prix Caprilli: These classes include a jump within the test. Can be ridden in jump tack. Walk/Trot Class includes 1 foot cross rails. Training Level includes jumps up to 2 feet.
- 15 minute Test & Video with Katelyn Victoria Razumovsky USEF 'r' Judge: This is a 15 minute sit down with Katelyn to review your score sheet and a video of a test that was performed that day. During this time you'll be able to talk strategy, ways to improve, exercises to practice and steps needed to progress toward the next level. Great for first time competitors, riders new to Dressage or riders feeling stuck at a certain score or level.

Leadline Dressage Test NO.

Purpose: To introduce new riders to the sport of Dressage and demonstrate introductory knowledge of horses. Riders will show that they can sit correctly holding either the reins or a strap. Rider to be led through test saluting at the beginning and the end.



RELEASE OF LIABILITY & ASSUMPTION OF RISK AGREEMENT

For and in consideration of Katelyn Kok DBA KV Dressage ("KV") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a KV event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities; I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable rules, and policies including:

- I acknowledge that all horse handlers and riders will wear protective headgear which meets or exceeds the quality standards of the SEI certified ASTM standard while riding and being near horses and understands that the wearing of such helmet may reduce the severity of any injury incurred, and if I choose not to wear such helmet, I assume all such risk of injury resulting therefrom. I further agree that all minors must wear protective headgear while riding.
- I acknowledge that while on the Host Equine Facility direct loss or damage, theft, or injury to Client's horses, tack, or equipment is not covered by Releasees' insurance. Releasees shall not be responsible for such loss, damaged, stolen or injured property. I understand that I am responsible for carrying my own health insurance and personal property insurance.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF INHERENT RISKS: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with equine activities, including but not limited to horseback riding and equestrian sport, are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the KV Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").

WARNING: CAUTION: HORSEBACK RIDING AND EQUINE ACTIVITIES CAN BE DANGEROUS. RIDE AT YOUR OWN RISK. Under Kansas law, there is no liability for an injury to or the death of a participant in domestic animal activities resulting from the inherent risks of domestic animal activities, pursuant to sections 1 through 4. You are assuming the risk of participating in this domestic animal activity.

C. ASSUMPTION OF RISK: I understand that the aforementioned Risks may be caused in whole or in part or result directly or indirectly from the negligence of my own actions or inactions, the actions or inactions of others participating in the KV Events, or the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties defined below, and I hereby voluntarily and knowingly assume all such Risks and responsibility for any damages, liabilities, losses, or expenses that I incur as a result of my participation in any KV Events. I also agree to be responsible for any injury or damage caused by me, my horse, my employees or contractors under my direction and control at any KV Event.

D. WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNITY: In conjunction with my participation in any KV Event, I hereby release, waive and covenant not to sue, and further agree to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the following parties: KV, Event participants (including athletes/riders, coaches, trainers, judges/officials, and other personnel), the Event owner, and competition managers; the promoters, sponsors, or advertisers of any KV Event; any charity or other beneficiary which may benefit from the KV Event; the owners, managers, or lessors of any facilities or premises where a KV Event may be held; and all directors, officers, employees, agents, contractors, and volunteers of any of the aforementioned parties (Individually and Collectively, the "Released Parties" or "Event Organizers"), with respect to any liability, claim(s), demand(s), cause(s) of action, damage(s), loss, or expense (including court costs and reasonable attorney fees) of any kind or nature ("Liability") which may arise out of, result from, or relate in any way to my participation in the KV Events, including claims for Liability caused in whole or in part by the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties.

E. COMPLETE AGREEMENT AND SEVERABILITY CLAUSE: This Agreement represents the complete understanding between the parties regarding these issues and no oral representations, statements or inducements have been made apart from this Agreement.

If any provision of this Agreement is held to be unlawful, void, or for any reason unenforceable, then that provision shall be deemed severable from this Agreement and shall not affect the validity and enforceability of any remaining provisions.

I HAVE CAREFULLY READ THIS DOCUMENT IN ITS ENTIRETY, UNDERSTAND ALL OF ITS TERMS AND CONDITIONS, AND KNOW IT CONTAINS AN ASSUMPTION OF RISK, RELEASE AND WAIVER FROM LIABILITY, AS WELL AS A HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNIFICATION OBLIGATIONS.
